Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) State Plan- California's Implementation Plan is being drafted so there are opportunities for public comment on the framework June 7 and 8 at SDCOE, plus a couple of webinars. Review the draft and try to attend meeting. We've received six updated policies to add to the COI policy clearinghouse. 60% of wellness policies are less than five years old, 30% are five to nine years old, and 10% are over 10 years old. Supporting Wellness- Preschools, Heather Ransons and Josh Bariuan YMCA CRS	 Through the CHIP REACH grant, YMCA Childcare Resource Center worked with Chula Vista Elementary School District to create policy language to incorporate into the districts wellness policy. This language is now available for any district to use and modify to fit their needs. Heather gave an overview of some of the ways wellness looks different in the preschool setting on a school campus: Serving family-style meals is a best practice for preschools. Family-style meals are beneficial because they support gross and fine motor skills development, help with language development, build confidence, teach children how to clean up after themselves, and help children recognize hunger cues. Physical activity should teach children fundamental movement skills, spatial awareness, and boosts self-esteem. Both structured and unstructured PA opportunities are ideal, with a recommendation of 60 minutes of each type for full day and 30 minutes of each for part-day care. Physical activity should not be used as a punishment. Outside of meal and nap times, children should not be sitting for more than 15 minutes at a time. Classroom screen time should be limited to no more than 30 minutes per week. Resources for early childhood educators include: NAP SACC, Preschool Foundations and Framework, Caring for our Children, SPARK, CATCH, and Lam Moving Lam Learning. YMCA staff is currently providing technical assistance to Warner Springs and Vista on incorporating preschool language in their school wellness policies as part of the County's NEOP program. Inviting a Preschool manager or teacher or an early childhood advocate to participate at district wellness meetings is a good first step, especially if a district is not planning to revise its policy over the next school year.
