1. COI Mission and Instructions	 Kim opened the meeting; Laura led introductions. 	
2. Strategic Planning	 Rebecca provided a recap from the July workgroup meeting and seven potential focus areas for the workgroup for the next two year plan. The group provided a recap of the August meeting and the presentation by Jenny Fererro with Palomar College. Potential collaborative opportunities with higher education may include: guest lecturing, identifying ways to support students to share best practices once they enter the workforce vs. maintaining the status quo, elective courses, and through continuing education trainings. The Chula Vista grant for SSB reduction was not funded. The following revisions were made to the draft strategic plan: Objective 1: Identify early childhood indicators and work with partners to collect/gather data for inclusion in the next State of Childhood Obesity Report in 2019 and to support domain as a whole Review available QPI data (NAPSACC-self report) Objective 2: Explore and potentially develop a COI education portal for early childhood stakeholders by Potential activity: Form an exploratory committee to scan current portals to see what already exists Objective 3: Support at least 3 early childhood organizations with PSE technical assistance to enhance the health and wellness of young children Since grant funding was not received for Objective 4, it was removed. Objective 5: Partner with at least one community college or university to provide upstream instructional support / guidelines to all early care in their education Due to time constraints, the domain logic model was not reviewed as a group. Rebeca asked domain partners to look over the activities, outputs, and short-term outcomes and report any revisions	 Invite Ramon w/ UCSD to present on PE/ PA with Muslin communities Follow up with Jenny about guest lecturer opportunities Review the domain logic model and forward CHIP staff any recommend changes Add workplan development to the October agenda.

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3. Partner Announcements	 California Food Policy Advocates is hosting a forum Oct. 26 in Sacramento on new policy recommendations. Kim McDougal will be a panelist since the YMCA CRS was involved in surveying childcare sites. The director of MAAC is now moving over to become the executive director of First 5 San Diego. NHA has a new Director of Head Start, Annie Rodriguez, and new Director of Family Services, Kim Flowers. 5 & Fit program connects seniors 55+ with preschools to teach children physical activity and gardening. YMCA CRS received a grant from San Diego County Office of Education to provide nutrition education and physical activity mentoring to QPI sites. Family Wellbeing project will be promotion 5210 material and will provide more updates soon. They will also provide teacher trainings on the I am Learning I am Moving curriculum. YMCA CRS SNAP contract is working to add preschool language to the Warner Springs wellness policy. Ramon Hernandez with UCSD Center for Community Health presented on ways to improve physical activity with Muslim youth. Breastfeeding Friendly San Diego provided trainings for childcare providers and following the training, one provider commented on the increased level of trust as a result of the training. STEM Minds Start Early is hosting a community conversation on why natural curiosity needs to be encouraged at a young age. The event is October 27 at the San Diego Central Library. AAP is hosting a literacy fundraiser October 5.
