1. Introductions	Kim opened the meetings and led introductions.	
2. Icebreaker	This was the first time since meeting in October of last year that the workgroup has been together. In order to reconnect everyone around the table, Nina led the workgroup through an icebreaker activity that helped the workgroup members provide a more in depth introduction.	
3. Workplan Development	 Circling back to the last meeting where Rebecca Alvarez led the workgroup through the Strategic Planning process, the workgroup brainstormed potential projects for the next two years. The workgroup refreshed through the workplan to see if there are activities that potentially everyone around the table can provide support with and work towards. The workplan activities are not final and can be revised at any time based on the capacity of the workgroup. Laura Niksch is the lead for the first activity on the workplan and she provided an overview of those current efforts and action steps. Some of the activities that have been identified are doing a scan of preexisting available data that will support inclusion of domain partners in the next State of Childhood Obesity Report. Up to this point both WIC and HeadStart have been identified as two partners that have a plethora of data sources to be used and will be looking to the workgroup for identifying more potential data sources and for collecting and maintaining updated data. One of the biggest goals of this is to obtain better indicators to include in the next State of Childhood Obesity Report. A goal to achieve these action steps have been set around April and May 2018. For the second objective, the workgroup decided on potentially developing a COI education portal for EC stakeholders. CHIP staff and Laura will be responsible for conducting a scan of what data already exists, gathering resources and potentially housing this information on the COI website. Kim McDougal is the lead for supporting at least 3 EC organizations in enhancing the health and wellness of young children through TA and PSE. One of the activities for this objective is to support the public library with curriculum for their summer and after-school programs. This stemmed from a presentation at one of the EC Domain meetings that the workgroup found connections within their programs to potential infuse health and wellness components.
