Vision Zero	<ul> <li>Circulate SD has been working on the Fatal 15 which are the top 15 most dangerous intersections in the city of San Diego since last year. The Mayor's office made a commitment to fix the fatal 15 in this upcoming budget cycle which is a big win for Vision Zero. The data that is being utilized is Circulate's data analysis. They are also working on a crash analysis that will be released soon and used as well.
