COI Mini- Grant Update	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Application deadline for the third round of Mini-Grants closed last Friday, June 8. There were a total of 15 applications received. Historically, in the first round there were 7 applications total, the second round there were 30. So this year was a great number of applications to be reviewed. There were a variety of applications from many organizations, however even after the mini grant webinar half were still program focused rather than a collaborative environmental change project. The COI and Community Domain Co-chairs will be setting a date within the next few weeks to review applications and decide on a winner. The chosen project will then be presented at the COI Leadership Council in July. The COI is hoping to have more updates for the next meeting. Nina has recently heard back from the Environmental Health Coalition who was the winner of the second round of mini-grant funding. They have not completed the mural yet. They were hoping to complete it last month, however, they

They have decided more forward with creating an erasable mural to avoid any conflict.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The COI is looking to adjust their funding and work on revising their grant around the scope of work based on the challenges. 	
<p>Forums</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On Wednesday, June 20, 2018, SANDAG and Alta Planning + Design will host a forum designed to strengthen applications for funding through the Active Transportation Program (ATP). The 2018 awards will range from a minimum of \$250,000 to greater than \$10 million. The forum will bring together engineers, planners, and school administrators/staff to walk through the application process and share local resources. Additionally, the forum will provide opportunity for attendees to develop meaningful connections with one another with the goal of securing funding for Safe Routes to Schools and active transportation infrastructure and programming throughout San Diego County. • Alta Planning + Design is developing one-pagers on the most deadliest corridors around school locations for nearly every city, which will be available at the forum. • The workgroup brainstormed networking activities and offer suggested questions for conversation starters. • CA Walks is offering technical assistance training opportunities focusing around bike and pedestrian focused trainings. • It sounds like they want to provide training tailored to the community level and place-based focused. Trying to brainstorm communities that would be interested. Reached out to Bayside Community Services and may be interested in doing something there. • The workgroup is still deciding if this is something that the Community Domain can support. If not. More discussion will take place at the next meeting.
