COI Mini- Grant Update	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There were a total of 15 applications received. In the past, for the first round there were 7 applications total, the second round there were 30. The COI and Community Domain Co-chairs reviewed the applications and decided on a candidate. The project proposal was presented at the Leadership Council meeting and was officially selected to receive the funding. 	<p>Bring the mini-grant applicant list with brief descriptions of projects to the next meeting.</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The selected candidate will be notified by the end of this month and the COI will have more updates for the next meeting. • The COI is looking to adjust their funding and work on revising the scope of work based on the challenges. 	
Forums	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On June 20 SANDAG and Alta Planning + Design hosted a forum designed to strengthen applications for funding through the Active Transportation Program (ATP). The forum brought together engineers, planners, and school administrators/staff to walk through the application process and share local resources. There were about five school districts and nine cities in attendance. • Alta Planning + Design has developed one-pagers on the most deadliest corridors around school locations for nearly every city, which are available on the COI website. • The next round of funding is not until 2020 which will allow more time for collaboration and partnerships. • CA Walks is offering technical assistance training opportunities focusing around bike and pedestrian focused trainings. • It sounds like they want to provide training tailored to the community level and place-based focused. Trying to brainstorm communities that would be interested. Reached out to Bayside Community Services and may be interested in doing something there. 	
Workplan Projects	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The workgroup is creating a funder list for those applicants of the mini-grant who did not receive funding. The COI has been compiling a list of funders and looked to the workgroup to provide additional funding opportunities.
