<p>2. Baby Toddler Behavior Resources for Providers</p> <p>Kathleen Merchant</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Kathleen has been in contact with the Executive Director of the UC Davis Human Lactation Center, Jane Heinig. They originated baby behavior research and materials and works closely with California WIC. UC Davis received funding to develop a whole series of modules as a part of a toolkit for parents and childcare providers. The toolkit includes materials, video segments, handouts in Spanish and English, and other resources. The modules are password protected so that the Lactation Center can provide trainings to those centers who are making the information available to the parents. They are in the process of figuring out their distribution pattern before allowing the modules to the general public. Once the provider goes through the training modules they are able to disperse the information however they would like. SDSU WIC has been featuring some of the module videos in the lobby waiting area. The workgroup expressed their interest in the modules and training to utilize as a tool for their organizations. The Early Childhood Domain might be interested in integrating these resources as well. Worplan Action Items</p>	<p>2-1-1 Project Update</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The last 2-1-1 Project meeting was canceled and as an ongoing project update, there are children still being enrolled into the program and the ongoing participants have been completing their calls. • At the next meeting there will be more updates. <p>Healthcare Provider Forum</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recently Dan, Cheri, and Dean were on a call with a few members of Healthy San Diego’s Health Education and Cultural and Linguistics Workgroup and are hoping to collaborate on a training with the managed care plans in late summer/early fall for providers related to childhood obesity. • Bridget who is involved with the Health Education and Linguistics and Cultural Workgroup provided an update on the provider training status. • Healthy San Diego has approved a provider training to happen in Quarter 1 of 2019. Healthy San Diego also can provide incentives such as food and whatever else will be needed for the training. • Now the workgroup needs to hone in on a topic for the training. In the last meeting, the workgroup discussed 5210 general messaging, breastfeeding, baby basics, and toddler behaviors. • The workgroup discussed narrowing the topic down to focus on the UC Davis Baby Toddler Behavior Resources and potentially incorporate SSBs and Rethink Your Drink.
