 education workshops. The area is mixed sociologically, high poverty rates, 4,000 people under the federal poverty guideline level within a few miles, with limited resources. Some of the major issues that this community has in particular is gang activity and have identified that the community wants a safe space to take their families too. The farm is community run and volunteer base who has several hundred visitors every month, so by installing a gate around the parking lot helped to create a safer environment. It took several weeks of prep for the build day along with several volunteer days prior. On September 3rd, over 70 people attended the first official build day. During the build day they allowed the community to contribute their ideas to the space. The space includes green areas, raised beds, picnic benches, the farm, a gated safe space, and will continue to be added upon. The domain will continue to brainstorms way to help support this project moving forward. •	Kim met last week with Blanca's colleagues, Elle Mari and Kate Mahoney, with the
	suggestion to partner with the Linda Vista Market as a place to paint the mural. It was
	determined the space is not an ideal location because the building does not have too much
	publicly visible space.

<u>Linda Vista Elementary School</u>

- Kim met with the Magnet Resource Teacher at Linda Vista Elementary and spoke about the potential to host the mural onsite at the school instead of in the intersection. They unanimously approved and they were relieved to hear it may not be an intersection mural, as they said that was not the best canvas for the mural and for the direction the school is heading. They were more pleased with the idea of painting the mural on their school grounds. They're in the midst of an entire campus beautification effort, so it aligns well.
- Because the school is a public facility, the artwork would need to go through the SDUSD School Board approval process. Their next meeting is in January, and the proposal would have to be submitted by October 15th or else it will be delayed until the next meeting in February.

Montgomery Mural Update

• The City has confirmed that Bayside would need to do a full street closure again to update the mural. Kim has not yet contacted the artists to see how long they would need to touch up the mural but will reach out to the artists about getting a quote for both the Montgomery the Linda Vista Elementary mural.

CHAMP Map Update

- Zac has been working on creating a new Community Health Action Map Partners (CHAMP) mapping project, since the old one no longer worked. The Community Domain, in collaboration with UCSD Center for Community Health, the County of San Diego and various community stakeholders launched a new tool this year that maps community engagement groups that empower and train residents to make positive changes in their neighborhoods. This resource highlights groups focused on increasing access to healthy foods and beverages, opportunities for physical activity, and safe routes to healthy places throughout San Diego County.
- The goals of the map are to chart the collective ideas and networks surrounding community engagement efforts within San Diego County. Connect peer-to-peer with other community engagement groups and residents working on similar focus areas in the same places. Inform ongoing projects and cross-collaboration, and identify groups working to increase access to healthy foods and beverages, physical activity opportunities, and safe routes to healthy places
