<b>Action Items</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Mary Beth Moran is now in connection with David Bond and will see if he is available to attend the next meeting and work to incorporate a mental health perspective to the workgroup efforts.</li> <li>The workgroup discussed going dark in December due to the holidays. A final decision will be made at the next meeting.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Presentation:</b>  <b>Mother's Milk App. and S.D Milk Bank</b>           Lisa Stellwagen</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Dr. Stellwagen and team shared an update on the development of the San Diego Mobile Milk Bank and the Mother's Milk app. and how the domain can help in the efforts.</li> <li>The mission is to encourage mothers to breastfeed and provide education to both new mothers and their family.</li> <li>The goals of the Mother's Milk Bank are to provide community breastfeeding education, drive milk donations, universal access to donor milk for county premature and ill infants developing a milk bank with HMBABA.</li> <li>There are 26 milk banks in US and only one in California (San Jose).</li> <li>The milk is cultured and pasteurized to kill off viruses and bacteria prior to distribution.</li> <li>Mothers can go into her community and donate/ utilize saved milk similar to a blood bank.</li> <li>The milk processing will be held at the San Diego Blood Bank and are currently cultivating the milk bank facility that is planned to open next summer.</li> <li>First 5 is redeveloping their app to talk about broadly development. There may be opportunity for some cross activities.</li> <li>UCSD Center for Community Health just finalizing breastfeeding friendly child care videos which talks about the importance of encouraging breastfeeding, how to store it, label it, and how to become a recognized BF friendly cite. This could be an opportunity for cross collaboration.</li> </ul> <p><b>San Diego Mothers' Milk Bank App</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Free smartphone app for breastfeeding mothers in San Diego region. The app is currently available for iPhones and will be available for Androids within the upcoming weeks.</li> <li>The app includes a news feed similar to Facebook and open forums to allow mothers to share their concerns, updates, and support. Mobile messaging to mothers regarding the basics of breastfeeding, birth planning, video content, breastfeeding techniques, blog topics, scientific research, storytelling, and events.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Mary Beth give swag to the Rady Wellness Team to incorporate in promoting throughout the hospital.</li> <li>Kathleen follow up about the launch of the WIC photoshoot and resources and share with Lisa.</li> <li>Collaborate and work with the domain to help drive the app and info.</li> <li>Dean link with Naomi through the coalition and connect Lisa with Cindy</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The San Diego Milk Bank came up with swag giveaways to help spread the word about the Milk app. The workgroup members took some swag back to their organizations to help promote.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Baby and Toddler Behavior Training for Providers Update</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The provider training is set to occur within quarter one of 2019. A specific date has not yet been identified.</li> <li>Kathleen spoke with Jane and Kim Elkins about the baby and toddler behavior training. Jane would be providing the toddler behavior training while Kim would provide a training on baby feeding cues.</li> <li>This training will be focusing on engaging medical provider staff, nursing staff, medical assistants, and office staff that have interaction with patients.</li> <li>The training will be located at 211 Connections Center.</li> <li>Having Jane as a speaker would be ideal as she can tailor the appropriate amount of materials for the audience.</li> <li>Kim Elkins will be attending the CPMG annual meeting on November 2<sup>nd</sup>, providing education for providers and parents on baby and toddler feeding cues. The workgroup discussed how that would be an optimal venue to start spreading the word about the provider training.
