This event is also meant to reinvigorate partnership and allow for a networking opportunity. The Community Domain will have a hand in the discussion when building this event. • Additional forum ideas that are in the beginning stages of planning include two ideas. One is framing the forum around funding and the other around corporate funding opportunities that they provide to our partners.
