| Opportunities     with     Community     Eligibility     Provision (CEP)      Paloma Perez     Bertrand, San | <ul> <li>Paloma provided an overview of CEP as an option for schools to provide universal free meals to all students without the burden of individual applications</li> <li>Schools must have greater than 40% of their Identified Student Population (ISP) qualify for free or reduced price meals (FRPM) to be eligible for CEP.</li> <li>Provision 2 is another option many schools use for universal free meals, but reimbursement through CEP is higher as all meals are reimbursed at the full rate.</li> <li>Paloma can help districts work through this calculation to determine the best option.</li> </ul>   | For more information contact Paloma@sdhunger.org                               |
