Assessing Progress in Wellness Policy Implementation Heather Cruz, CVESD	 Casey Mackareth, Harder + Co. Community Research and Heather Cruz, Coordinator of Physical Education, Health and Wellness, provided an overview of the assessment of CVESD's wellness policy implementation: 40 of 46 schools completed an online wellness policy implementation survey 33 of 46 schools have a designated site wellness lead Assessed topics for the online survey included: smart snacks (competitive foods), nutrition services, health and physical education, physical activity, policy and environment, and employee wellness. Casey Mackareth, Harder + Co	 Schools were scored on a scale from 1 to 4 based on whether policy components of these topics were: not in place (1), under development (2), partially in place (3), or fully in place (4). Schools received average scores for each topic based on the components of CVESDs wellness policy and scored the highest for smart snacks (3.27) and nutrition services (3.02) and the lowest on policy and environment (2.57) and employee wellness (2.15). Heather has already begun working with schools to address areas for improvement. 10 schools also participated in an observational assessment that covered child nutrition and physical activity: All participating schools offered time for physical activity and healthy foods, but were given recommendations to improve access to water and quality of play equipment.
