Live Well San Diego originally had four sectors: Schools & Education, Business & Media, Cities & Government, and Community & Faith-Based. Last year added a fifth: Youth.

Created a framework for meaningful participation and opportunities for young people to use their voice on topics and in departments that really affect youth.

Youth Engagement Framework:

- 1. Youth advisors & youth leadership team (2 youth advisors & adult allies) 15 youth in Youth Leadership Team paid positions
- 2. Youth training and professional development
 - a. Increasing social capital
 - b. Access to trainings & workshops that they may not have access to
 - i. Strengths finder
 - ii. Govt and county structure
 - iii. Collaboration among youth-led groups
 - iv. Being a leader in the community
- 3. Youth convening & collaboration
 - a. Youth-led town halls (open to all youth; county-engaged youth)
- 4. Youth mentorship & service
- 5. Youth engagement on boards & commissions

Prospective timeline for Pilot Year:

- Feb: onboarding of 15 youth leaders (in process)
- Mar-Apr: Training youth leaders
- May-Aug: Mentorship & internship
- Sept.-Dec.: Youth-led Town Halls





Breakout Session

• Breakout session: how does the Trauma-Informed Code of Conduct apply to COI?

- A multi-system trauma informed approach refers to: 1) coordinated cross-system strategy for ensuring a shared understanding of trauma and its impact, and 2) collectively aligning policies, practices, and services for supporting healing and resilience.
- ➤ In alignment with *Live Well San Diego*, the Trauma-Informed Code of Conduct was created by young adults from multiple groups.
- The four core elements of the Trauma-Informed Code of Conduct include:
 - 1. Safety-A safe and open-minded place where I feel welcome
 - 2. Individualized Support-Assist me and considers the factors affecting my situation.
 - 3. Effective Communication-Providing me with clear and consistent information.
 - 4. Supportive Staff-Is kind and has a true and genuine passion for helping me?
