Grossmont Union High	BP (2019)	2	<p>The Board may enter into a joint use agreement or memorandum of understanding to make district facilities or grounds available for recreational or sports activities outside the school day and/or to use community facilities to expand students' access to opportunity for physical activity.</p>

Julian Union High	BP (2017)	2	<p>The Board may enter into a joint use agreement or memorandum of understanding to make district facilities or grounds available for recreational or sports activities outside the school day and/or to use community facilities to expand students' access to opportunity for physical activity.</p> <p>Use of School Facilities Outside of School Hours School spaces and facilities are available to students, staff, and community members before, during, and after the school day, on weekends, and during school vacations. Most notably, the Julian High track is available to community agencies and organizations which have need of an exercise space. School policies concerning safety will apply at all times.</p>

Lemon Grove	BP (2018)	13	<p>The Board has entered into a joint use agreement / memorandum of understanding with the City of Lemon Grove to make district facilities or grounds available for recreational or sports activities outside the school day.</p> <p>Further, the district has an administrative regulation and process in place for outside entities to request and/or to use community facilities to provide as many opportunities as possible for children to get at least 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity during the course of a day.</p>
16. Mt. Empire	BP (2017)	2	The Board may enter into a joint use agreement or memorandum of understanding to make district facilities or grounds available for recreational or sports activities outside the school day and/or to use community facilities to expand.
17. National	BP (2023)	6	As necessary to ensure efficient use of school facilities, the Superintendent or designee may, with the Board's approval, enter into an agreement for the joint use of any school facilities or grounds. The Board shall approve any such agreement only if it determines that it is in the best interest of the district and the community.
18. Oceanside Unified	BP (2021)	5	To maximize opportunities for indoor and outdoor physical activity, the district makes available school facilities to the greatest extent possible to the City of Oceanside and other organizations through joint use agreements and other methods. Schools are encouraged to proactively seek opportunities that allow parents, staff, and community members to use school facilities for physical activity via youth and adult programming.
